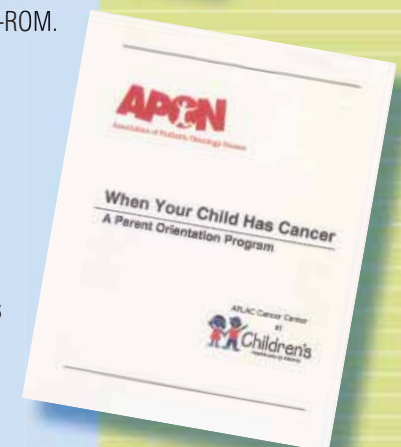


When Your Child Has Cancer (1999)

Pediatric Tumor Series: Handbooks for Families

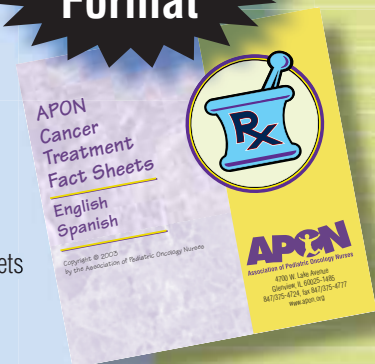

Pain Management in Children with Cancer (1999)

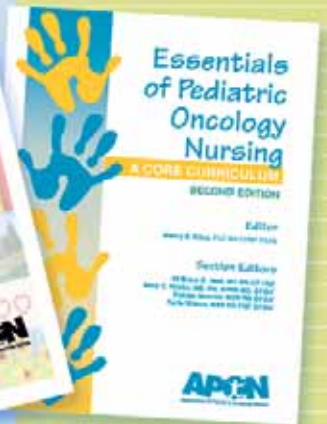
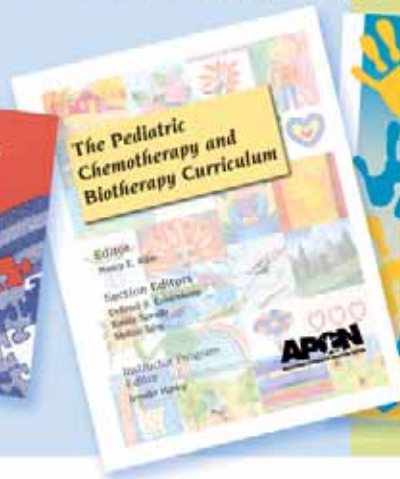
