

### **COURSE OBJECTIVES**

- Define and discuss the treatment approach for thrombotic microangiopathy in the context of pediatric hematology/ oncology.
- 13. Identify how to maintain hope amid worries, false hope, and belief in miracles during palliative care.
- 14. Explore how the common theme of hope plays a significant role in childhood cancer survivors' stories leading to their pursuit in nursing careers.
